## Saying Goodbye to Regrets

In the March/April 1995 issue of Health Magazine, a report was published detailing what people *regretted the most* in their lives. Some lamented having turned down marriage proposals, while others were sorry, they hadn't chosen a different profession; but from the 213 responses made, there was one regret which came to the forefront most often: ***the failure to seize the moment!*** Undoubtedly, many of the respondents had formulated dreams and made big plans for themselves and in their relationships with others, but when the time came to actually implement the plan or act upon the dream, they froze with fear- a fear they would fail or would end up looking foolish.

Wouldn't it be wonderful if the brain had an off switch you could flip to block out the memories of regret when they came to mind? But alas, no such switch exists! This doesn't mean though, we have no way to deal with the negative feelings associated with ***regrets***.

I realize that when we take a cursory look at the life of the apostle Paul, it appears he was a man who had it totally together spiritually, and while this is generally an accurate picture of the man's character and faith, we cannot ignore the fact that Paul had to deal with some regrets in his life. Read the first part of 1 Timothy 1:13 and you will see that this godly man was never able to forget that he had once been an enemy of the Cross and God's people. Couple this passage with what is read in 1 Corinthians 15:9 and you see that there is little doubt that he actually wrestled with this regret. Did he allow the past to eat away at his soul so that he was deprived of fellowship with the Lord? No! His approach to handling his past demonstrates that while we may experience shame that accompanies regret, we can still be forgiven (1 Jn. 1:5-10) and that forgiveness allows us to triumphantly move on! It's true we can't forget what we've done (or not done), but if we are in Christ (Rom. 6:1-23; Heb. 9:11-18; 10:14-23), we can be fully confident that any regrettable incident will not, cannot, be held against us in any way by the Lord (Heb. 8:12). He, through the blood shed by His Son on Calvary, removed the burden of shame and regret from the soul and provided the means by which a person can experience a new beginning (2 Cor. 5:14-19)! With such wonderful knowledge, we should be able to see that while we might do foolish things which in turn create regrets, we do not have to live with them as if they were anchors of sorrow around our necks.

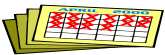
