Step Up

When was the last time you were in need? Not a simple need but a true or desperate need. How did you fill that need? Did you work extra hard? Did you spend sleepless nights planning on how to take care of that need? Did someone come and help you?

In Acts 2 we see how the early Christians handled their needs. Acts 2:44-45 says, "And all those who had believed were together, and had all things in common; and they began selling their property and possessions, and were sharing them with all, as anyone might have need.

When the Christians saw each other in need not only do they sell their possessions, but they sell their property. They go above and beyond what we might expect. They were committed to each other. Then once they had sold their things, they shared with anyone who had a need. They saw a need and they did what they could to take care of each other's needs.

Another example similar to this is in Exodus 36. The Israelites are contributing their items so that the tabernacle could be built. The men who were building the tabernacle come to Moses in verses 5 and 6 it says, "And they said to Moses, "the people are bringing much more than enough for the construction work which the LORD commanded us to perform." So, Moses issued a command, and a proclamation was circulated throughout the camp, saying, "Let neither man nor woman any longer perform work for the contributions of the sanctuary." Thus, the people were restrained from bringing anymore." The Israelites are bringing so much that they have to be told to stop giving!

Last Sunday Alabama and Georgia faced a terrible storm that left many in a world of confusion. Their homes were damaged or destroyed, people were hurt, and loved ones were lost. We often pray for opportunities to be a light in our community. It's a tragedy that this storm came through. What will our response be? What will your response be? An opportunity is banging on your door. How will you help? What are the things that you're able to do? There are many ways to help during this time and we all have something to contribute. Let's have a response that echoes the prophet Isaiah saying, "here am I send me."
