Don't Forget to Laugh

When's the last time you laughed? I mean, a good, from the belly, hearty chortle? You say, "There's really nothing to feel happy about because the world is so sick and perverted and morality is at such an all-time low, I can't feel anything but pessimism and depression!" I would agree that it does sometimes appear the spiritual and ethical climate is so grave, there really isn't anything to laugh about; but even as sorry and as cold the hearts of men have become, it doesn't mean we should surrender a God-given ability- the ability to laugh- to the circumstances and resign ourselves to a apathetic, hopeless, and full of dread existence! If we would just concentrate on finding the true joys in life (Phil. 4:8), then we would be benefited in the following ways: (1) our physical well-being is enhanced (Prov. 17:22- "A merry heart does good like medicine..."). Over the past few years medical research has uncovered the fact that there is a direct link between one's ability laugh and the good health of the body. God knew about this link from the beginning! (2) our emotional perspective is raised to a higher level (Prov. 15:15- "*All the days of the afflicted are evil, but he who is of a merry heart has a continual feast.*"). We would all probably lose any sense of hope, faith, and morality if we did nothing but focus upon all the evil and callousness each day seems to bring; but if we would diligently seek out the positives, especially those things which make us laugh or bring a smile to the face, then we might be pleasantly surprised on how those evil days are actually full of blessings. With this approach, our mental outlook is bound to improve! and (3) we can better influence others to change their pessimistic outlook on life to a more optimistic one. Solomon wrote. "*A joyful heart makes a cheerful face...*" (Prov. 15:13). If people around you constantly wear such a long face that they could "eat oats from the bottom of a ten-gallon bucket", doesn't it tend it put you in a foul frame of mind? But if they have a physical, emotional, and spiritually upbeat approach to life and the handling of its difficulties and trials, and that approach shows on the face, doesn't it motivate you to smile as well?

So, you see, God gives us the ability to laugh for reason. Let's try it more and as a consequence, we will discover a tremendous difference in our soul and life in general.

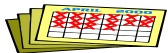

If you were to describe someone like Abraham Lincoln, what would you say? Maybe you would say he was an honest man. He was a man that made difficult decisions. You could say that he did what he could to restore peace. Maybe you would describe him by his physical features. You'd say he was tall, he had a beard, and that he wore a tall hat. These things would give a basic but good understanding of Abraham Lincoln.

How would you describe yourself? When you think about who you are, what do you focus on? Are you quick to point out flaws? Do you see yourself the way that others do? Do you see yourself as God does?
