Not An Impossible Goal

In 1962, Sam Walton held a grand opening celebration for a second store in Harrison, Arkansas. To entice would be customers to the event, he had a truckload of watermelons dumped on the parking lot and offered free donkey rides for the kiddies. As the day wore on, the parking lot asphalt temperature rose to 115 degrees⁰, causing the watermelons to explode! Couple that catastrophe with what donkeys naturally do, it meant that not only did Walton have a messy parking lot, but that the mess was tracked into the store as well!

Many that day were convinced that Walton's goal of operating a successful business empire was completely unattainable; but rather than allow that one awful incident to define his vision, he pressed on.

This is the approach we all should take- as individual saints and as congregations- when it comes to setting and achieving spiritual goals. We must not allow any negative thought, perception, or attitude to defeat us in striving to achieve what we are privileged to do for the Almighty and for ourselves when it comes enjoying the promised abundant life (Jn. 10:10)- and for reaching the goal spoken of in Philippians 3:8-14). To NOT set such goals is a guarantee for failure and stagnation; therefore, in the context of the Lord's love, mercy, providence, and promises, we dare not be fearful in launching out in faith to accomplish some specific individual and/or congregational goal. But to achieve it, we must: (1) believe the goal can be met; (2) believe in the significance of the goal; (3) do our individual part, while relying upon God, to help the goal be realized; and (4) be convinced that God will providentially enable us, if it is His will, to triumphantly reach our goal and then set a new one that will bring honor to God and His Kingdom.

Today, Walmart is worth 386 billion dollars, with over 4,769 stores (Discount, Neighborhood markets, Superstores) internationally; indeed, had those skeptics in 1962 been able to look into the future and see how Mr. Walton was determined to snatch victory from the jaws of defeat that day, they undoubtedly would have "jumped on his business bandwagon," and could have lived and probably died wealthy people! One day though, the achievement of Walton's secular goal will mean nothing (cf. 2 Pet. 3:10-12; 1 Cor. 9:25). This isn't the case concerning the reaching of our spiritual goals. As we work to accomplish such lofty aspirations, we can be sure they will "pay" off in eternity (Matt. 6:19-21; 1 Cor. 9:24-27)!

Learning from Jonah

When you read the prophets, you see a common theme of God's love for His people and His anger for their sin. God speaks through the prophets to deliver His message of repentance so that they don't suffer. When we look at Jonah, the city that Jonah is sent to is Nineveh. This is incredibly important because it shows that God cares for other nations as well and not just Israel.

Jonah didn't want to go and eventually when he ends up in Nineveh, he delivers God's message that they need to repent. The whole nation turns from their ways and God didn't punish them. Here is where we see an interesting interaction between Jonah and God. Jonah 4:1 says, "But it greatly displeased Jonah, and he became angry." This makes him angry, so what does he do? It says in verse 2 that he prayed! He tells God that he knew that God was a merciful God that would have mercy if the people repented and that he would prefer to be dead. Jonah is worked up and angry over something wonderful that has happened!

In the last verse of the book God tells Jonah, "Should I not have compassion on Nineveh, the great city in which there are more than 120,000 persons." God cares about those even when they haven't been following Him. 2 Peter 3:9 says, "The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance."

How is our attitude towards those that we don't get along with? Do we pray for them? Do we share our faith with those as we do with those we love? The lesson we should learn from Jonah is that God's love is for all and everyone's soul is worth saving.
