Doing What's Right Isn't Always Appreciated

Colin Swift became a man without a job. He wasn't fired due to incompetence or for being lazy, but because he failed to notify his supervisor he was leaving work to render aid to an elderly couple suffering simultaneous heart attacks. According to company rules, any employee going off the job before quitting time must either contact his supervisor or obtain written permission acknowledging an absence. Swift, a volunteer EMT, stated that he didn't have the 10-15 minutes it would have taken to locate his boss, but that he told a co-worker why he was leaving. Subsequently, he was fired from his job of 18 years. Said Swift in response to his dismissal, "I thought someone's life was worth more than going through the ritual of hunting up a supervisor." Doesn't reality demonstrate that when a higher good (as defined by God's word) can be performed, sometimes "rules" have to be suspended? But as seen in this incident, sometimes doing what's right, especially if there's a perceived violation of a human standard, is not always appreciated!

Our Lord faced the same situation during His earthly ministry. The Pharisees became irate when the Master would heal on the Sabbath because His actions violated their "rules" (Matt. 12:1-4; Lk. 13:10-16). It made little difference to those individuals that souls were being saved and bodies were being made whole. Jesus dared not consult with the religious hierarchy before He did what was right and good, and those in power couldn't stand it!

Things haven't changed. In our day, we still experience a lack of gratitude when we attempt to do what's right. Christians can be criticized when they seek to render benevolence or show compassion to say, the non-Christian, because this goes against someone's "rules" of who can be helped, and there can likewise be a barrage of criticism leveled when a congregation might have a different order of worship implementation. The "bosses" of tradition become upset when performing the good and right is seen as contrary to the way they have done always done "it, whatever "it" (we're not talking about doctrinal issues here) may be.

While our service in the Kingdom is to benefit men, it is not performed to gain praise from them (Gal. 1:3-6); rather it is done to bring praise to God (1 Pet. 2:12-15). It does not matter, in the context of eternity, whether men appreciate our godliness; what matters is that God does (1 Cor, 4:1-5). The Father does acknowledge and appreciate our doing what is right, for even the giving a cup of cold water will have its reward (Matt. 10:42). Indeed, people may not always welcome our breaking of their rules and human traditions when seeking to do what's right, but let us be of courage to never "lose heart in doing good, for in due time we shall reap if we do not grow weary" (Gal. 6:9).

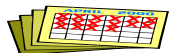
