Length vs. the Quality of Life

Over the past 100 years, life expectancy for the typical American has increased by over 50%. On average, an American woman can hope to live a total of 80.1 years, while the average male has the expectation of living 73.4 years on earth. Those figures pretty well match those given in Psalm 90:10, don't they?

Of course, an individual's physical longevity can be negatively or positively impacted by the factors of heredity, lifestyle, and environment, and we are constantly being told by those "in the know" that while there are some elements in the above factors that we can't control, we need to be more diligent in working on those things to which we can apply oversight. I wonder though, if we put all our emphasis on the LENGTH of life, will we neglect paying attention to the QUALITY of living?

We've all known individuals who have lived well into their 90's, but for as long as we've been acquainted with them they've been cynical, bitter, and unappreciative wretches! On the other hand, we've been associated with people who have had their beings cut short at 25, 30, or even 50, and who, even in that relatively short period of association, we felt richly blessed by having them as part of our existence. They were always smiling, always trying to find the good in bad people and bad situations, and they continually felt blessed. Even though they might have been struggling with trial, had their bodies seized by pain and disease, or were experiencing circumstances that brought others to their knees, they maintained a positive outlook and sought to give encouragement to others! Why the difference between the two types? I would submit that the latter had a focus- not on their troubles or themselves- but on God and His grace (2 Cor. 12:7-10)! Their priorities were different- more spiritual, more noble in nature- and that approach enabled them to enjoy a quality of life that made each day truly worth living! Can we ourselves, no matter how long or short we physically live, have this same quality of existence? You know we can, but we must be committed to pursuing the lifestyle heralded in 1 Peter 3:8-11: show compassion, be tenderhearted and courteous, be and give blessings, have right speech, avoid evil, do good, and seek peace!

What's the Point?

Everything you do has a purpose. If you wake up in the middle of the night for a midnight snack, then the purpose is to fill your stomach. If you are studying for a test, then the purpose is to do well on that test. Everything we do has a purpose and the same is true about God. Everything He does serves a purpose.

When you look at what God has done you begin to see the overarching purpose of His actions. He sets the Israelites apart from other nations. He makes them His holy people. He guides them along the way. All along the way there are prophecies about a Messiah who will save His people. Finally, the Messiah comes. The Son of God arrives in the flesh. He teaches, heals, lives the perfect life, dies, comes back to life, and ascends back to heaven.

What is the purpose of it all? To understand that we have to understand a choice that was made a long time ago. Genesis 3:6 we see Adam and Eve disobey God for the first time. When they do this, they are separated from God and cast out of the garden. From that point on God's mission is to save His people. He does it.
