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## Can't Sleep? Count Your Blessings Instead of Sheep!

Do you know what poses the greatest threat to the physical well-being of man? It's WORRY or ANXIETY! The Saxons knew about the destructive power of this emotion because they viewed it as a "vicious animal clutching at a man's throat" or as "a wolf strangling a helpless sheep in its jaws." How do a lot of people cope with worry and its effects? Some turn to alcohol in an attempt to escape and others will immerse themselves in self-pity; still others will seek out a misery partner, a person with whom they moan and complain, but who won't or can't do anything to help the sufferer deal with the problem. Then there's that age-old remedy of trying to occupy the mind by counting sheep so that t so that sleep might come. But sadly, people find that even after doing all these things, they're still anxious.

Most of us know that the word of God admonishes us to remember that worry for a Christian can be sin, but how many remember the same word also gives us sterling examples of individuals, who by faith, were able to put anxiety out of their minds and get on with living a productive, healthy, and peaceful life (see Psa. 32:3,4; 37:1-11; Isa. 26:3; 32:17; Matt. 6:19-34; Phil. 4:6)? As we read about these examples, we see that in spite of trial, hardship, and daily concerns, men and women of faith were able to lay their heads upon their "pillows" at night and enjoy sweet rest.

How DO we win over worry? I'd like to give but one suggestion, but it's a monumental one! This suggestion is gleaned from a song written in the 40's or 50's and it points out very well how one can climb above anxiety and discover the peace that passes understanding. The opening line goes: "When I am worried and cannot sleep, I count my blessings instead of sheep; and then I fall to sleep." Aren't these thoughts Biblical? In light of this thinking, allow me to ask, "Why is it that the Lord Himself, in spite of all the cares and heartaches warring against His spirit, was able to experience peace, joy, and fulfillment?" Don't you think it had to do with the fact He never forgot to thank His Father for the blessings bestowed upon Him (Lk. 22:19; Jn. 6:11; Matt. 15:32-36)? The words of the Bible urge us to "forget not the benefits of the Lord" (Psa. 103:2; 116:12,13), to "pray without ceasing and in everything give thanks" (1 Thess. 5:17,18), and to "continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God..." (Heb. 13:15). These are not mere suggestions; they are admonitions, which if obeyed through faith, can help us see life in a more focused and balanced way. If we take the time to list the continual ways God has shown his love and care for us, we really won't have time to complain, fret, or fume; and guess what? We'll be able to sleep much better at night as well! So stop fretting and start counting your blessings!

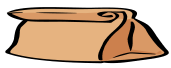
## MEETINGS

### Be a Hero

When we look at hero's we see someone who is brave, strong, confident, and usually dressed pretty cool. We see the qualities that they have, and we want to mirror them. Then when we try to do that, we see how difficult it may be. We need to look to true examples instead of fiction to find real examples of leaders.

Let's look at real people who dealt with real problems. Let's look at biblical examples of people who overcame their fears and weaknesses and find out how they did it. The first example is Moses. When we think of Moses, we imagine this huge example of faith. Moses started off nervous. When God tells Moses to talk to Pharaoh, Moses comes back with nervousness and excuses. Exodus 4:1, "What if they will not believe me, or listen to what I say?" Exodus 4:10, "Please, Lord, I have never been eloquent...for I am slow of speech and slow of tongue." Exodus 4:13, "Please, Lord, now send the message by whomever Thou wilt."

Let's look at someone like Jeremiah. This guy was a prophet. He's the guy that would tell the people what God is saying to them. When God speaks to him, we'd imagine that his response would be "yes, okay, anything you say!" Instead we see him say in Jeremiah 1:6, "Alas, Lord God! Behold, I do not know how to speak, Because I am a youth."

These people that we see as larger than life symbols of faith started out just like us. "What do I say? I'm not the best speaker. Someone else would be better. I can't do it." God doesn't accept that. He tells them that it won't be their words but His. It's not their ability but it's His power.

Today we have His Word, His Spirit, and His Love. What will you do with that?
