Wisdom from Outsiders

When was the last time you were in a crowded elevator? If it was recently, I can guess what most people were doing on the ride—perhaps even what *you* were doing. Most people probably reached in their pocket, grabbed their smartphone, and began scrolling through social media or possibly sending a few texts. It's likely that, other than a "hi" or "have a good one," very few words were spoken.

Now, this isn't an article on elevator ethics. In fact, I'm not suggesting you, me, or the other passengers did anything wrong in that situation. But I do hope to illustrate something for you: *we do our best to live in a bubble.*

We would much rather listen to what our friends have to say on Facebook than listen to what a stranger has to say on an elevator. We would much rather listen to what Fox News has to say than what MSNBC has to say...or is it the other way around? We would much rather read books that affirm everything we already believe than books that challenge us to reflect on our convictions. And on and on we could go!

The problem is that when we isolate ourselves from the world, we develop "tunnel vision." We only see what we want to see and often refuse to consider things from another perspective. Or, put differently, we do our best at times to live in an "echo chamber." We like to hear our convictions "echoed" back at us!

This would be great if we were always right! Of course, the reality is that we are *not* always right. We need to listen to other perspectives because it just might help us discover that we haven't quite mastered it all.

This was the case in Jonah 1:5-16. Jonah was trying to live in his "echo chamber," but God graciously intervened. He used a group of pagan sailors to show Jonah just how misguided he had become. *Read that sentence again.* God used a group of *pagan sailors* to offer a corrective to Jonah!

It is easy to tune out the world with a dismissive attitude: *what could they possibly teach us?* The story of Jonah, however, calls us to realize that sometimes the world calls the church to account for its behavior. God can actually use those who are outside the faith to challenge those inside the faith! We can be called to refine our beliefs, to improve our behavior, and to increase our love.

This doesn't mean that the world is always right. But it does mean we need to learn to *listen!* It could be that God wants to confront us with wisdom from outsiders.

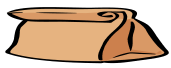

True Generosity

Have you ever lost something really valuable or sentimental? You look all over for it, but no matter where you look it's just not there. It's one thing to lose something you care about but what if you were told that you had to willingly give it away. How would you feel? Would you be hesitant to let it go? When the time came would you actually go through with it?

We often think selfishly about our things and become protective of them. This isn't a concept that we see in the Bible. Let's go back to the biggest gift ever given, Jesus. He was given for us. He was given to a sinful world full of sinful people.

1st John 4:10, "In this is love, not that we have loved God but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins."

John 3:17, "For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through Him."

God gave His own Son so that this world of sin could be saved. He willingly made that sacrifice knowing some would accept Him and that many would not. That speaks volumes about His love, generosity, and grace.

Let's look back at ourselves. Our lives should be crafted around the image of Jesus and guided by God's Word.
