Do You Believe In Miracles?

The sharp shriek of the whistle filled the arena. The coach bellowed, "AGAIN!" The hockey players on the ice were exhausted...in fact, they had just played a full game a mere minutes earlier. Coach didn't care—they had played poorly, had taken the game far too lightly, and weren't united in the slightest. So, he ordered them to retake the ice and for what felt like an eternity he ordered them to skate.

They skated to the closest blue line and back, then to the center red line and back, and then to the far blue line and back, and finally to the end of the rink and back.

As they gasped for breath, the whistle screamed. "AGAIN!" They repeated the drill.

Whistle. "Again!" Skate. Repeat.

These young hockey players had been chosen to represent the USA in the 1980 Winter Olympics, and Herb Brooks was intent on coaching them to victory. But at the time, it just seemed like Coach Brooks had lost his mind!

The rink manager came down and informed the team that he was leaving and needed to lock up/turn out the lights. So Coach Brooks had him leave the keys and turn out the lights...and they stayed and kept skating the team up and down the ice even with the lights off. No relief.

The legend of that night, made famous by Disney's *Miracle on Ice*, is that the punishment ended when the team captain finally cried out that he was "Mike Eruzione" and that he played—not for Boston, his college team—but for "the United States of America"!

It's doubtful that this is the actual reason why Coach gave them rest. It's more likely that he had proven his point by skating them so hard and was ready to move on. But one thing is not debatable: *Herb Brooks turned a group of rival college hockey players into a unified team.*

They faced the USSR hockey team, the juggernaut of the hockey world, and defied impossible odds to defeat them. The odds were so rare that the announcer, Al Michaels, hadn't even prepared material for if the USA won the game. All he could do at the final horn was exclaim, "Do you believe in miracles? Yes!"

For as long as people remember this special hockey team and these great sports moments, we will continue to be impressed with the power of teamwork and unity. It turns out that the 1980 Olympic team had something in common with Nehemiah and his mission to fortify the city of Jerusalem. As we will see this morning, Nehemiah was like Coach Brooks—able to bring people together, to overlook differences, and to function as a unified team!


SMALL GROUP BIBLE STUDY

Before the Battle

Has life ever surprised you? I want to look at David and Goliath and see how so much of the moral from this story we know so well takes place before the battle.

David was charged by his father to go and find out how his brothers in the army were doing. When David arrives, he hears the challenge of Goliath. David, unlike the rest of the Israelites, isn't afraid. Instead he responds in 1 Samuel 17:26, "What shall be done for the man who kills this Philistine and takes away the reproach from Israel? For who is this uncircumcised Philistine, that he should defy the armies of the living God?"

David wasn't focused on the physical presence of Goliath; he was focused on the spiritual presence of God. It's a good thing too, because his oldest brother opposes him! His brother accuses him of having evil in his heart that's making him curious to watch the battle. David, the man after God's own heart, took his brother's verbal assault and continued on. He didn't turn back and go home. He was rooted in God.

Then David talks to the king. When David volunteers to fight Goliath, instead of the king being glad that someone finally stepped up, he also criticizes David. He tells David that he's too young and inexperienced. Again, David is rooted in God and is confident.

We look at this story and see a boy vs a giant. Truly though the victory is won before the battle. David knew God would provide the physical victory, but to get there he had to be spiritually prepared before the battle.

David was able to do what he did because he was confidently rooted in God. Put your roots in God and know before the battle where your hope is found.
