Anchors Aweigh!

I am so appreciative of each of our *fantastic* volunteers who have helped put on a great VBS, even if it wasn't the exact same layout as past years. We had volunteers who planned, organized, decorated, taught, led groups of kids, made crafts, and so much more. Most importantly, our volunteers greeted all the children with a smile in the joy of the Lord, sharing the love of God!

As I was writing this article during the week, I was thinking about the "Anchored" theme of VBS. I thought of a familiar phrase, but I have to confess that I have heard the expression "anchors aweigh" my whole life without realizing what it meant. In my mind it was spelled "anchors away," and I thought it was about dropping an anchor to keep a ship stationary.

But it is actually an expression used by sailors, including the Navy, to indicate that there are no anchors on the sea floor and the ship is ready to depart—quite the opposite meaning!

As Christians, we understand that we have "an anchor." We sing about "an anchor that keeps the soul," and we even had a great VBS yesterday based on this theme! Perhaps you recall Hebrews 6:19, "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure."

The metaphor of Jesus, and our hope in Jesus, anchoring us through life's troublesome days is a powerful one. But can I bring a different point to you based on "anchors" and the phrase "anchors aweigh"?

Sometimes in life we are not anchored in our hope, but we are tied down by our attachments to sin and the distractions of life. As a ship cannot reach its destination when it is anchored to its port of origin, neither can we reach our destination if we remain anchored to this world.

I am reminded of Hebrews 12:1, "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us."

In order to finish the race of our faith, it is certain that we will need *the* anchor of hope in Christ. But it is also certain that we will need to *let go of other anchors* in our life that seek to "weigh" and "cling." We will need to look at these temptations or distractions and say, "Anchors aweigh!"

Using Your Head

I guess he was proud of himself upon the success of his quest, but I have to wonder if the tremendous headache he must have suffered after the deed was worth proving to others that he had a hard head!

In Proverbs 23:7 declares, "For as a man thinks within himself, so is he." The meaning is simple: Whatever you think about the most is what you do and eventually become! So, what are you using your "head" for?
