The Disciple Whom Jesus Loved

If you've read the Gospel of John, you're probably familiar with the "beloved disciple" that pops up throughout the narrative on five occasions. It is not too difficult to figure out that this disciple is none other than John, the author of the book!

There have been various theories pointed out as to why John referred to himself in this way rather than simply by name. Some people believe that it was out of humility, leaving himself unnamed so as not to promote himself in any way. Others think that perhaps John wanted to emphasize that his relationship with Jesus was the only thing that mattered, and ought to be the only thing that mattered to his audience as well.

These, and others, are just *theories*. We don't have a "preface" to John's Gospel that clarifies it, so we are left speculating. Evidently God did not see it necessary to tell us why, so we can't speak definitively.

However, the other day I read a short article by a woman named Christa Threlfall. She told a story about reading the Gospel of John with her children. They had just read John 13:23: "One of his disciples, the one Jesus loved..."

Naturally, her children were curious as to who the mystery disciple was and why he was given this description. Christa explained that the "beloved disciple" was John the apostle and began discussing why he might have referred to himself in that way.

But her nine-year-old looked up and in one short sentence probably crafted a better commentary than any of the hundreds of pages of scholarship devoted to the identity of the "beloved disciple."

The child said this: "*He must not have been loved like that before.*"

Whether or not that was *the* reason John wrote the way he did, I do not know. But I know that this nine-year-old child was *exactly right* about John's experience. No one ever loved John like Jesus. John followed Jesus all his life, from the time of his calling until the time of his death decades later...and never was there anyone who loved John like Jesus.

We are here to worship today because we are also "beloved disciples." We are people gathered to say: "No one ever loved me like Jesus loves me!"

“\$1,000 for throwing trash on the highway.” Have you seen that sign while traveling on Interstate 185 between Columbus and Atlanta? One thousand bucks out of your pocket for just littering; seems a little extreme, doesn't it? But state officials appear to be pretty serious about deterring people from throwing garbage on the roadway, and they're willing to make us remember the law by fining us for a violation!

When I saw that warning, my thoughts went to another type of “littering; but instead of trash being thrown out on the highway and ruining the pretty scenery, I got to thinking about what would happen if we could “throw” positive things into the lives of people whose hearts were cluttered with “garbage.” There are many individuals – including teens- whose lives are full of doubt, fear, anxiety, sadness loneliness and even sin. The beautiful soul with which they were created now looks marred with ugliness, and those who have such trash piled on top of them have a hard time seeing the beauty God has created around them.
