Not a Word, Not a Person

Joshua and the people of Israel had just been in a battle with Ai. Joshua had led a group of Israelites up to face Ai, and the army of Ai rushed out toward Joshua. Joshua and his army, seeing the full military force of Ai, turned and fled. But they didn't flee from terror or fear, they fled because there had been a plan—the best warriors of Israel had set an ambush. When they came upon Ai, they routed them and were victorious.

Joshua knew before the battle that the Lord would deliver them (Josh 8:1-2). So, when the battle had concluded Joshua set up an altar to the Lord and worshipped God with the people (Josh 8:30-31).

What's interesting is that it is here that Joshua makes a copy of the Law of Moses. All of Israel gathers around Joshua as he wrote on the stones. And when Joshua had finished, he made sure that all of Israel was gathered on the hills around him so that they could see him and hear what he had to say (Josh 8:32-35).

There was *not a person* of Israel who did not hear Joshua. The kids were there, the women were there, the men were there, the foreigners who had been living with Israel were there—*not a person* was absent.

There was *not a word* of the Law that Israel did not hear, for Joshua read to them "all the words of the law—the blessings and the curses—just as it is written in the Law of Moses" (v. 34).

Joshua wanted the people to hear *the words of God*. As we've been talking about in our Wednesday night series, Joshua believed in "eating the book"—he believed that every soul in Israel ought to be fed by the words of God.

Now, that's a very high view of Scripture—no doubt about it. But my emphasis today is that it is also a very high view of *people*. Joshua had a radical sense of the *equality* of all people as every soul in Israel was allowed to listen to the words of God and take them into their lives. Joshua could have read the Scriptures only to a select group of elders, or to the head of each clan, or to only the Israelite men, or to only Israelite adults, etc.

When I read about the children being present, I immediately thought of Jesus in Luke 18:15-17. Jesus didn't view sharing God's message with children to be a distraction or a burden, but he patiently said: "Let the children come to me!"

For Joshua, everyone had both the privilege and the responsibility to personally receive the holy words of God. And today, the same is true—the gospel is for all!

Staying in Touch with YOUth **Don't Fool Yourself**

An overweight man walked into a donut shop with a friend and ordered 12 glazed donuts. They sat down at a table and the hefty fella began to eat the entire box of sweet treats- without offering his companions any. The guest looked at him asked, "Do you think eating 12 donuts is good for your weight?" The glutton answered, "No, eating them all won't hurt me because I'm only eating the holes." It doesn't make what logic the guy was using, he was still consuming 3,600 calories- hole and all!

It's a fact of life that when we want to do something that's not good for us or is against the Lord's will, we try to convince ourselves that's it's okay, that nothing bad is going to happen and that there won't be any long-lasting negative consequences. Oh, and that's exactly what Satan wants us to do!

Look at Genesis 3:1-6. The devil provided Adam and Eve with just enough doubt about God's commandment about eating from THE tree that they convinced themselves it would be okay to munch on, we suppose, just one piece of the fruit. Satan worked, apparently, the same way in convincing David it was okay to take a census of how many soldiers he had in his army (1 Chron. 21:1-3), and when Judas made up his mind to betray Jesus for 30 pieces of silver (Lk. 22:3-6; Matt. 26:14,15). Many times, in our own lives, we can be sure that the devil will seek to "plant" the wrong ideas in our head that God doesn't care of we commit a "little" sin or that He's not watching when we travel down the road of disobedience. The devil seeks to practice mind control with us and if we are not always on guard and striving to block out his efforts in the same way Christ did when He was being tempted (Matt. 34:1-17- "it is written), we will do some mighty foolish things. We can control our thinking, make it clear and righteous by remembering Proverbs 3:5,6- "*Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to Him and He will make your paths straight.*"
