Highs and Lows

Have you ever been excited to share some good news with someone? Maybe you got a new job, were able to find a great deal on a vehicle, finished working on a project, were about to leave on vacation—whatever it was, you couldn't wait to share with your friends and family.

The conversation began and just as you were about to change the subject to your good news, someone else brought up something very difficult going on in their own life. Maybe they lost a job, had a car break down, had a relative who was ill, or some other hardship. And there you were, wanting to share your good news but now almost feeling guilty for having good news in the first place!

The truth is that it is part of our shared human experience that each of us have "high times" and "low times"—we all have moments to celebrate and moments to mourn. In fact, Solomon tells us as much in Ecclesiastes 3:4: "There's a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance."

One of the challenges is that our highs and lows often come at different times—which means while one person is rejoicing, another is often weeping. Thus, Paul writes: "Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep" (Rom 12:15).

Now, that is no simple task! It is quite challenging to do the opposite of how we are feeling—to rejoice when we feel like weeping, to mourn when we feel like rejoicing. It is hard, when you feel like your whole world has crumbled, to rejoice in the successes of others; it is also hard, when you have been struggling and *finally* something has gone your way, to pause and weep with someone who is hurting.

But Paul compels us to surround one another in both highs and lows, to celebrate with one and to mourn with another. Why? What are the benefits of "rejoicing with those who rejoice and weeping with those who weep"?

First, it gives us a vision of the *body* of Christ—the unity and oneness of the Church. Paul wrote: "If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it" (1 Cor 12:26). We are all connected through Christ as more than just acquaintances or even friends: we've been made *one*.

Second, it allows us to process important emotions. If you've ever had a season of loneliness, depression, grief, or heartbreak, do you remember how refreshing it was anytime someone made you genuinely laugh? At the same time, when things are going well it is helpful for us to pause and grieve with others—it gives us empathy and perspective.

While it isn't easy, it is actually a blessing that our highs and lows come at different times. Those that are on the mountaintops can support those in the valley, and those in the valley can celebrate with those on the mountaintops!

The people inhabiting the small town of Newstead, New Zealand are proud of their patrol officer hen and feel that it does an excellent job in controlling traffic on school days. The only drawback to having the fowl serve in this capacity is that when it's raining, it quits early in order to seek some shelter.

How do you personally feel about this safety patrol chicken? If you were a parent, would you entrust your child's welfare to its actions? Hmm, I know I would be a little dubious; but when it comes to my spiritual safety and security, I do know who I can trust, and I do so, without a moment's hesitation! Our God never takes a day off, never has to sleep, never has His attention diverted, and never has to seek shelter from the storms of life (Psa. 121:1-8). At any moment, a one-ton car can squish that poor chick, but there is nothing that can overcome the power of our God. He is always there for us, encouraging us through His love, helping us to overcome through His providence (1 Cor. 10:13) and giving us strength and security through His grace. Satan and the world may be barreling down on us with their trials and temptations, but because God offers complete spiritual security (Heb. 13:5,6; Psa. 91:1-12), we can get out of the way (Heb. 5:9; Jas. 4:7,8)! Yes, Newstead may have a safety patrol chicken, but I've got God to lead me through the valley of death into the paths of safety (Psa, 23).
