Something Worth Fighting For

As many of you know, I am a huge Colorado Avalanche fan. Growing up in Colorado, I have watched the Avs through many struggling seasons before getting to this season where they were able to win the Stanley Cup. It was a huge accomplishment for them and it took a lot of sacrifice.

There was a report that came out after they had won, though, that caught my attention. It was about one of the Avs starting forwards, Andre Burakovsky. He was seriously injured in Game 1 of the Conference Finals, taking a puck to the skate which broke his ankle. For most people, a broken ankle would mean several weeks of recovery and light activity—but Burakovsky was able to work with doctors to make it possible to skate *with a broken ankle*. Hockey players are tough!

So, out he skates a few games later on a broken ankle (unbeknownst to fans or the other team). It's now the Stanley Cup Finals. One of Tampa Bay's stars takes a slapshot and Burakovsky slides in front of it to block it. So a puck moving about 100mph collides with his hand, breaking his thumb into four pieces.

Fast forward a few more games. It's Game 6 and the Avalanche are able to defeat Tampa Bay in Florida and win the Cup. But guess who was back in Denver, prepared to play in a Game 7 if it came to that? Andre Burakovsky. Broken foot and broken hand, but still ready to fight.

My dad and I were talking about this story and I laughed and told him, "At some point, a silver trophy might mean *too much*." But that got me thinking...

If a hockey player will play the game with broken bones because he wants to fight for a trophy, how much more should we fight for the wellbeing of our families?

It's a harder fight than the Stanley Cup Finals: families are faced with relational, emotional, spiritual, physical, economic, and other challenges that make a 100mph slapshot look like a piece of cake. It requires a lot more than a willingness to break a bone or two—it requires patience, vulnerability, forgiveness, humility, service, grace, and so much more.

But the reward is a lot greater than a trophy and a week or two of celebrating. That reward comes in the big moments (weddings, baptisms, birthday parties and more), but it comes even more in the small ones: a laugh, a hug, an unspoken trust, a family meal, and many more. Ultimately we fight for our families because we long for an unending celebration together with our Father in heaven!

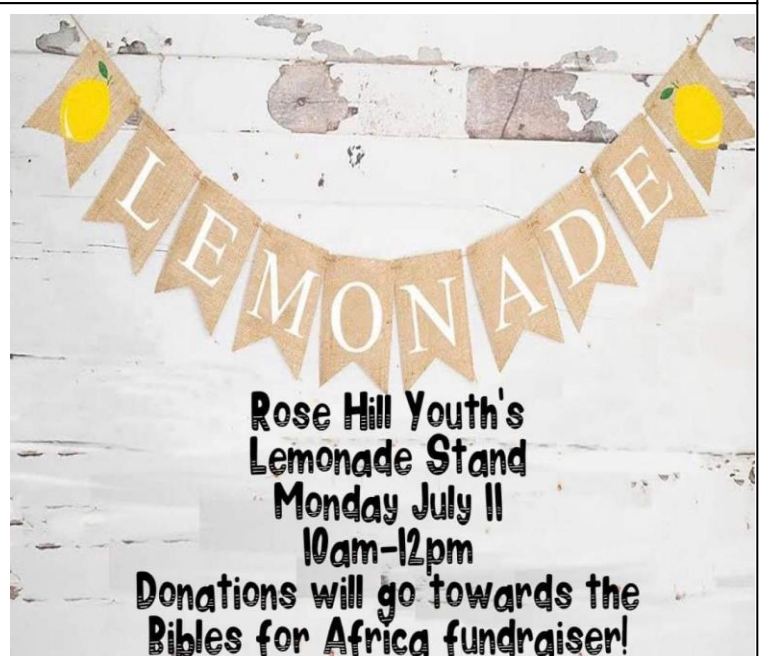

Staying in Touch

It's Always on God's Menu

Quiz time: Which of the following foods have never appeared on the menu at Mickey D's: *pizza, hotdogs, spaghetti, chicken noddle soup, lobster, onion McNuggets, fajitas, wings, and a pineapple* and a *cheese sandwich*? You may not swallow this as being true, but at one time or another, at some place in the U.S., every one of the aforementioned items has appeared on a menu at McDonald's. Why didn't they make it as regulars nationwide? Sometimes the item was ill-conceived (i.e., it tasted lousy), it was impractical as a fast food (spaghetti? Come on!), took too, long to prepare, or it simply wasn't cost efficient.

But in the reality of things, what do you feel your life-emotionally, spiritually and physically- would be like should God decide to remove certain things from heaven's "menu?" *What would our existence be like should Jehovah choose to withhold His mercy and grace from us* and simply say, "You are no longer forgiven, and I will do nothing for you regarding the spiritual mess into which you get yourselves (cf. *Psa. 103:10; Ezra 9:13*)? *How different would our life be if the Almighty refused to extend His providence to us?* This would mean that no good would ever come from bad, and we would be plunged into utter despair as we fought to find peace from every trial (*Rom. 8:28-38*)? *Think too, about the hopelessness our souls would experience should the Father deny us His comfort in our times of bitter sorrow* (*2 Cor. 1:3,4*). *Finally, what if the Lord above should conclude one day that we are no longer "worthy" of His love?* Not only would we plummet into the despair of loneliness, we would have no reason to live or purpose in life to pursue (*Jn. 3:16; Psa. 59:16; 94:18; Rom. 5:8*).

I think we can all agree that having the food items mentioned above pulled from the menu at McDonald's didn't create any hardships for mankind, but hopefully we can all agree that should God withhold His love, providence, mercy, grace and comfort from us would mean there would be no life at all!
