Planning to Fail

You've probably heard the popular saying, "Those that fail to plan are planning to fail." I think we all can appreciate the wisdom in that statement, understanding the value of preparation and thoughtfulness. Today, however, I'd like to spend a couple minutes reflecting not on planning but on *failure*. The reality is that our failures may at times be reduced by planning, but nothing can eliminate failure in our lives. We are fallible creatures in a fallen world: failure will be inevitable!

There are plenty of people who have made this simple observation. Teddy Roosevelt is often attributed as saying, "The only man who never makes a mistake is the man who never does anything." More recently Wayne Gretzky is frequently quoted as having said, "You miss 100% of the shots you don't take." Both of these men are trying to get us to understand that failure is inevitable but that it shouldn't paralyze us into doing nothing.

From the biblical perspective, we know that trying to stay on the bench to avoid mistakes is not a viable option. This was the attitude behind the man who buried his talent in order to "not lose" anything the Master had entrusted him (Matt 25:14-30). In other words, "playing it safe" is not the solution to the inevitability of failure.

Instead, Christians can have the unique and empowering understanding that we frequently fail (more often than we even know!), but that we don't have to be crippled with anxiety or fear because of it. We live as grace-covered and grace-led people!

When I say "covered"--I mean *covered*. 100%. No debate. Nothing withheld to hold over our heads. "There is now no condemnation in Christ," Paul tells us (Rom 8:1). We can boldly live in Christ because grace abounds through Jesus. While we don't go around intentionally sinning (Rom 6:1ff), we need not constantly fret as if failure will mean excommunication from God's family or God's presence.

We are covered with grace, and we are also led by the grace of God in Christ. The gift of abundant life which is ours in Christ is more than sufficient to motivate us to seek God's will and strive for spiritual growth. Since we know that our mistakes are covered as we endeavor to live like Jesus, we can have a vibrant joy that others around us are shocked by. While we don't aim to do sinful things, we can also "plan to fail"--that is, we can live life with the awareness of our imperfections and know how we can handle them through the grace of Christ.

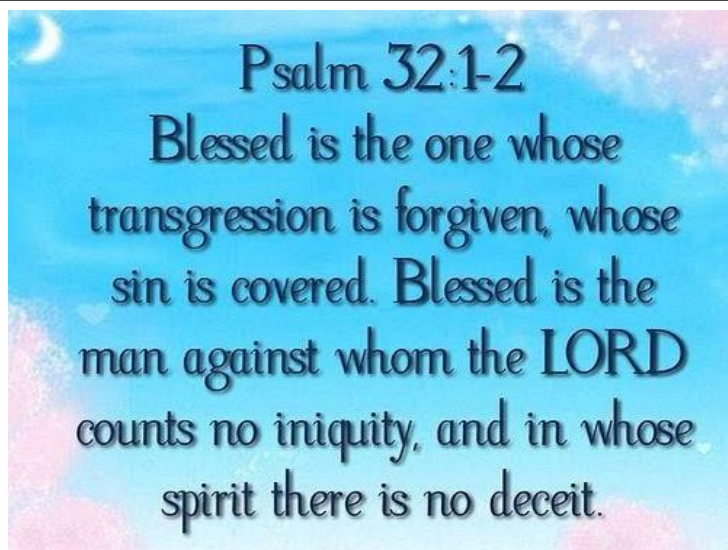

June Roundtree lost her dog. For weeks, she agonized over where her beloved pet was, if Abby was safe, and undoubtedly had hope every day that her pooch would show up at home.

One day Ms. Roundtree was working the cash register at Walmart when she looked up to see a black dog running by. Every few steps, the dog would stop and look up at a customer as if it was eyeing the individual with a specific purpose. Roundtree called out the name of her dog, and sure enough, it was Abby! Somehow the canine had entered the store, the very store where her master was working, and was frantically searching for the one who could take her back home, to a place of security, of warmth, of love and protection. She found what she was seeking!

There are indeed times when we stray from God, the very One who longs to be our Master and Lord, who without hesitation offers us security, spiritual warmth, unmatched love and protection from the evil one. When we are lost, we can keep wandering from situation to situation, from worldly circumstance to worldly circumstance, hoping to be "taken in," or we can diligently seek (Matt. 7:7) our Master and be returned to His fold. Abby came to the Walmart that was only 1.5 miles from her home, and likewise, we should never forget that God is not far from any of us (Acts 17:27). Because He is near, our searching never has to involve a decades' long, a month's duration, or even a day's interval before we are welcomed back home. He whom we seek through repentance, will always be found, and that fact should comfort us when we stray.
