## A Little Country Church

Many of you know that this past week we had traveled up to Tennessee for me to do a series of lessons for a church about an hour outside of Nashville. It is a little country church seemingly in the middle of nowhere outside of the slightly larger Springfield, TN. They probably have no more than 20 or 25 in regular attendance on Sunday mornings, maybe less. Most of the members are older, and many of them are related to each other in one way or another.

Someone, not at Rose Hill, told me that they were glad I was doing them the favor of coming out to preach for them. I kind of laughed to myself, because I had been done so many favors by this small country church that I couldn't repay with a year's worth of good sermons—let alone a week's worth. No, the favor was from them to me.

This little church is largely the reason why I'm able to be at Rose Hill today. They decided to let a freshman in college preach to them every Sunday until his senior year, and they even paid his travel expenses and a little more to do it. When Nashville traffic would make the preacher's 3-hour drive turn into 4, they would patiently sing together until he got there. As the preacher undoubtedly "ummed and ahhed" and stumbled his way through his first sermons, they smiled and nodded along as if the point was landing home perfectly. Lunch was paid for and a couch was always provided for an afternoon nap. Plenty more could be said!

When I was preparing to speak today about one of the most frequently requested topics throughout my years of preaching, namely that of the assurance of salvation, I couldn't help but think of this group of people. They modeled for me the beauty of being able to learn and grow in a safe, patient, and gentle environment. For Christians, that's what life is like because of Jesus!

Yes, we all have things to improve upon. We all have "next steps" in our faith that we want to eagerly and enthusiastically take. We have sins that need continually put to death, we have areas of our hearts that need continually surrendered, and more. But the message of the gospel is that we get to do that within the safe environment of the house of God. We serve a gracious, forgiving, patient, loving Savior who does not scoff or fume when we misstep but instead extends a hand to lift us back up again.

Each day we get to go to sleep resting in the saving power of Christ, knowing our soul is eternally secure through his life, death, and resurrection. Therefore, we can wake up with fearlessness to combat Satan and develop spiritual maturity. Knowing this, how can we not sing out and praise God this morning together?

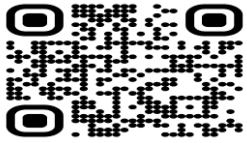
## BROWN BAG OF COLUMBUS
